IKEA kitchens: 10 most common myths

1. Elevations unframed unreliable and unstable to physical influences. IKEA uses high-MDF-fronts which are fixed with special screws and dowels. The rear panel is made of chipboard and is supported by pins.
2. MDF is worse than plywood. IKEA uses MDF consisting of a layer wood veneer coated with durable laminated films, standards-compliant E-1.
3. Drawers are made of cheap plastic and metal. In the kitchen from IKEA used Blum tandem box and guides made specifically to order the company IKEA.
4. Flimsy plastic feet. Each leg can withstand the weight of 124 kg. This means that the average kitchen table holds the weight of almost 500 kg.
5. The doors and drawers fronts are ephemeral. The company IKEA offers a 25-year warranty on your kitchen drawers and cabinets.
6. All kitchens from IKEA made only in a contemporary style. IKEA kitchens are divided into 4 groups of style: youth, modern, country style, and in Scandinavian style.
7. Kitchen sets are available only in standard filling modules. IKEA kitchen sets provide an opportunity to buy separate modules, thereby forming a kitchen set for individual sizes.
8. Cheap kitchens - means kitchens of poor quality. IKEA uses cost-saving measures at the corporate level to reduce the overall cost of production, manufacture, transportation, storage and merchandising products.
9. Assembly and installation is very complex. As shows practice the assembly cabinet takes less than 20 minutes. Thanks to the original system mounted cabinets that easily fixed to the wall.
10. The high volume of resales. IKEA makes good quality furniture on basic standards. Return on investment is much higher than the average kitchen remodel and unprofitable.
